North America is a continent [b] in the Northern and Western Hemispheres

[c] North America is bordered to the north by the Arctic Ocean, to the east by

the Atlantic Ocean, to the southeast by South America and the Caribbean Sea, and

to the west and south by the Pacific Ocean. Greater North America includes the

Bahamas, Bermuda, Canada, the Caribbean, Central America, the Clipperton, K

alaallit Nunaat (Greenland), Mexico, Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon, the Turks an

d Caicos Islands, and the United States of America.

Continental North America covers an area of about 24,709,000 square kil

ometers (9,540,000 square miles), representing approximately 16.5% of the Earth's

land area and 4.8% of its total surface area. It is the third-largest cont

inent by size after Asia and Africa, and the fourth-largest continent by populat

ion after Asia, Africa, and Europe. As of 2013, North America's population

was estimated at nearly 579 million people in 23 independent states, or about 7.

5% of the world's population. In human geography and in the English-speaking

world outside the United States, particularly in Canada, the terms "North

America" and "North American" are typically defined as including

just Canada and the United States.
